CAST NOTES

KENNETH MacDONALD (Mr. Roberts), president of the Civic Theatre this year, was last year's winner of the Best Actor award sponsored by the Junior Chamber of Commerce for his work in **Holiday**. Ken brings real experience to the role of "Mr. Roberts", since he was a Navy pilot in World War II with the rank of Lt. (jg), which is the same as that held by "Mister Roberts." He is sales manager of the Washtenaw Broadcasting Co., WPAG and WPAG-TV.

WILLIAM MEHEGAN (The Captain), although a newcomer to Civic Theatre, is no newcomer to the stage, having been in twenty-five plays in the last thirteen years, and having played twenty-one leading roles. During World War II, as a bombardier with the U.S. 8th Air Force, he was shot down over Germany and spent one year in a POW camp. He is presently a teacher in Ypsilanti High School.

RAE KIESTER (Lt. Ann Girard) has the distinction of being the only woman in the play. Formerly chairman of the University of Michigan Dames Drama Group, Rae is an Ann Arbor resident while her husband is in the Graduate School of Dentistry. She recently directed a Civic Theatre Workshop one-act play, and has had acting experience in Highland Park, Michigan, and Jacksonville, Florida.

This was a culmination of five years as stage manager, set designer, technical director and general handyman behind the scenes. On the Board of Directors, he is Vice-President and Business Manager of Civic Theatre.
