#### ABOUT THE CAST

Tod Barker (Lt. Wright) Having returned, once again, to Ypsilanti, he is returning to work in the theatre after a 4 yr. sabbatical. Although his interests span every aspect of theatre craft he is thrilled to be on stage after many years behind the scene. Look for him next season when he directs Medea for AACT.

Sarah Barkoff (Mary Lennox) is a 7th grade honor role student and cheerleader for Byrant Middle School. She made her acting debut at age 5 in Annie (Molly). At 8, she had the privilege to perform for 2 yrs. with the Third National Co. of Les Miserables as Young Cosette. Other credits include: The Sound Of Music, The King & I, The Nutcracker, and Puccinit's opera Tosca. She has appeared in two films: Soul Stealers and That Special Gift, multiple commercials and voice-overs. For 3 years she has studied voice with Dolly Paul. 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#### ABOUT THE STAFF

Leo Babcock (Master Painter) studied art and architecture in Paris, Copenhagen and at the U of M. As an architect with the theater bug it seems only natural that he has designed, built and painted a number of sets over years. In 1995 he was awarded best set for his design of AACT's South Pacific. On stage he was most recently seen as Nathan in Saline's Guys and Dolls and the Wolf/Prince in Dexter's Into the Woods.

Joy Baker Dennis (Director, Set Design) is pleased to be directing *The Secret Garden*, her second show for AA-CT. A graduate, BFA, of Emporia State University, she founded the Comm. Theater of Emporia, KA, a civic group which recently moved into their own theater. In the years since, Joy has worked in Indiana and Penn. as a director, scenic designer, and actress. She most recently directed *Jesus Christ Superstar*.

#### SOME THOUGHTS ON THE SECRET GARDEN (FROM THE DIRECTOR)

I was introduced to Mary Lennox and her Secret Garden at the age of seven by my aunt and uncle who had presented me with a copy of the Francis Hodgson Burnett classic that Christmas. I can remember my mother reading the book to me before I went to sleep, doling out this wondrous story a chapter each night. When before my literary tastes had leaned toward beautiful princesses being rescued by handsome princes, I found myself now completely captivated by a lonely little girl that had found her own way to happiness. The very idea that self reliance was an option for a girl was completely new. I guess you might say Mary Lennox was my Huck Finn.

When I heard that my beloved book had been made into a play, I was both pleased and apprehensive. Others shared my feelings of a possible mixed blessing. Actress Tyne Daly pulled composer Lucy Sirnon aside at the premier of the show on B-way and demanded of her, "You haven't ruined it have you?" I know exactly how Ms. Daly felt and I'm happy to report - no, they didn't!

Much has been made of the fact that an all woman production team put this show together initially. And the fact that its leading charader is a 10 year old girl, prompts the uninitiated to believe that it is a play for women and their daughters, or as my sons might say, "A chick thing." And part of me wants to say, "You're damn right it's a chick thing ... and why shouldn't it be?" And I might even stomp my foot impatiently as I know Mary Lennox would.

But the director in me savors the simple value of a good story well told. It knows no gender, racial, or religious boundaries. It appeals to that which is human in all of us. And I believe that this is the truth that Mary found in her Secret Garden, that Huck found on the river, and that each of us hopes to find in our lifetime - an appreciation for ourselves as individuals and the understanding that it makes us all equal.
