

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Bye Bye Birdie is an American classic...pulled out every ten years or so by just about every high school, college, and community theatre across the country. Surprising then, that this is the first such AACT presentation. Set in a 1959 America that never really looked as good as is imagined, it was the first Broadway musical to incorporate real "rock-and roll" songs in its score. Arriving on Broadway in 1960, it took the usually jaded New York theatre critics by storm, and created stars out of it's leads, Chita Rivera and Dick Van Dyke. Birdie was created in a time of innocence...before JFK, the Beetles, and the Vietnam war...before teenagers would forever change the way they viewed their world. And for a few hours, at each performance of Birdie across America, the cast, as well as the audience lose themselves to a world that never was, and strive valiantly to "put on a happy face." Who could not but hope to be honored with the privilege of directing and choreographing this happy mayhem? Enjoy!

GLOSSARY

Getting Pinned - going steady Abby Lane - Big Band singer

Sammy Kaye - Big Band leader

Loop the Loop - amusement park ride that flips one up and over (hence great for "dates")

Pedal Pushers - girls' tight fitting slacks, hemmed at the knee

Sock Hop - a dance in the gym with no shoes allowed so the floor would not get scuffed

DA, Crewcut, Flat-top - popular boys' hair styles

Flip, Beehive, French Twist - popular girls' hair styles


