

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

Act Three	Scene one: A wood. Night. Scene two: The vestry room of the Salem meeting house, now serving as the anteroom of the General Court.
Act Four	A cell in Salem jail, that fall.

### About the Cast and Crew

Morgan Bellock (Susanna Walcott) Morgan is currently a junior at Huron High School. She has enjoyed acting since she was young and plans to pursue it in the future. 


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
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
