From the Director

Admittedly, it is audacious, if not arrogant, to think oneself capable of directing a show as complicated and gargantuan as *Follies*. I have made myself vulnerable for taking on such a task, but a greater sense of vulnerability stems from explaining why I felt compelled to work with this rich, complex, amazing material.


Follies cleverly uses a reunion of former follies performers to explore the tensions between past and present, beauty and decay, dreams and realities, theatre and life. Using conventions of the 1920s and 30s musical theatre, the show conjures up "Loveland," an idealized view of life, beauty and romance, common to Ziegfeld Follies and other productions of that era. Sondheim's *Follies* uses "Loveland" as a backdrop to explore the complicated realities of life that often contradict the ideals espoused by popular entertainment. *Follies* is about confronting these contradictions and coming to grips with these realities.

For me, Ben's song "The Road You Didn't Take" captures the essence of *Follies*' message. When we're young, life stretches out before us with a vast array of possibilities and time seems limitless. There are many roads we could travel; many doors we could try. It's natural to feel hopeful, optimistic, ambitious, invincible. But time isn't limitless: we can't take all those roads or try all those doors. We have to choose. And choices have consequences. Life has an annoying tendency to slip by when we're not looking. Before we know it, we find ourselves a long way down some road wondering, "How did I get here?" Rarely does life turn out the way we thought it would. Sometimes that's a good thing. But sometimes we wonder about all those roads we didn't take—all those doors we never tried. How different might life have been?

There are three chunks of time with which we all have some relationship: past, present and future. These relationships change, of course, as we age. When we're young, there is little we have to discuss with the past, but the future is often close in our thoughts. As the years go by, the past has more to say. Sometimes it's a welcome guest. Sometimes it's a haunting ghost. In any case, our relationships with the past and future directly influence our relationship with the present. Ultimately, life is not yesterday or tomorrow. Life is today. Life is now. Some have criticized *Follies* for being pessimistic. While it certainly isn't optimistic, I believe *Follies* is realistic (albeit surrealistic in style): it instructs us to accept the imperfections of life. Plan for the future; savor the past; but live in the present. Loveland is an illusion. Life can't be perfect nor all that we want it to be, but maybe the secret to a more satisfying life lies in finding the right balance between striving to make life better and accepting it for what it is.
