This should be the most important Board in our city government, and this work should be carefully performed. I would, therefore, request that the matter of salaries of the Board of Health be investigated and that the Board be required to make monthty reports to the Common Council the same as other Boards, and that these reports become a permanent record by being published in your proceedings. proceedings.

Dear Sir-I believe that the conpensation Dear Sir—I believe that the conpensation of the Board of Health is not what it should be for the performance of labor necessarily imposed by a city of the magnitude of Ann Arbor. The time will soon arrive when lat-eral sewers will be extended to many parts of the city. And many privy vaults will require to be inspected and ordered to be emptied and the vaults filled. This alone will require much time. Also an increase of labor would necessitate monthly reports, from various necessitate monthly reports, from various quarters which is now almost unknown for the very reason that the compensation is too small. In my report for the year last past I mentioned what would be a fair salary for a health officer

The duties imposed on the inspector of the The duties imposed on the inspector of the Board of Health should be at least one hun-dred and fifty dollars. While the president of the Board should have at least one hundred dollars, (his position is something like the one your Honor occuples, therefore, his salary should be less). With a fair salary, monthly reports would be exacted from every physi-cian and undertaker in the city cian and undertaker in the city.
