- ROBERT LOGAN (Gil) . . . a former Civic Theatre president, is well remembered as Sakini in "Teahouse of the August Moon" this year; he acted in many CT productions as well as in the Little Theatre last summer. Bob is a photographer at Veterans Hospital.
- WILLIAM TAYLOR (Mr. Harper) ... also played in "Teahouse of the August Moon," and won a Civic Theatre Oscar several years ago for his appearance in "Picnic." He has been in numerous shows for University Play Production and the Drama Season. An Ann Arbor High School English teacher, Bill lived in England last year as an exchange instructor.
