NOTES ABOUT THE DIRECTORS, STAFF AND CAST

TED HEUSEL (Director), station manager of WOIA, is welcomed back as he celebrates his 17th consecutive season with AACT. Ted has acted in many plays, was co-producer of Drama Season for five years and has directed many outstanding plays for us, including an award winning show, THE MIRACLE WORKER, as well as such recent shows as CANDIDA, GYPSY, and last years' highly successful MARY, MARY.

CORA GREENBERG (Assistant Director), has been an active member of AACT during the past year, serving it in a variety of ways behind the scenes. A member of our Acting Workshop, Cora has also worked with the Ypsilanti Players as Assistant Director.

FRED REILLY (Mr. Foreman), appears for AACT for the first time, bringing with him experience in summer stock, Goodman Theatre in Chicago, American Theatre Wing Professional Training Program, off-Broadway as well as network radio-televison work. His occupation is medical administration.

ALLAN SCHREIBER (David Kolowitz), instructor in speech at EMU, has had experience as both actor and director. In the former capacity, he will be remembered for his AACT roles in VISIT TO A SMALL PLANET, MAJOR BARBARA, and his award winning performance in OKLAHOMA. He has directed for the Ypsilanti Players, and for the past two years for the U of M Gilbert and Sullivan Society. His next directorial assignment will be for AACT in the March production of Shaw's THE DEVIL'S DISCIPLE.

DAVID DUBOFF (Marvin), a U of M student, has appeared in OUR TOWN, I REMEMBER MAMA, in Drama Season's production of OH DAD, POOR DAD, starring Constance Bennett, and was an understudy in PTP's performance of THE CHILD BUYER. He has studied Drama at Interlochen National Music Camp and has participated in AACT's acting workshop.

CAROL DUFFY (Miss B), has to her credit appearances in NIGHT OF THE IGUANA, BECKETT, 7 YEAR ITCH, as well as an appearance with the Ypsilanti Players last season in WHO WAS THAT LADY I SAW YOU WITH. She also wrote and directed the AACT melodrama presented at the Street Art Fair, summer of 1965, and wrote and appeared in the melodrama presented this past summer. The mother of 3 children, Carol teaches at the Lincoln Laboratory School.

DON STEWART (Pike) has served AACT successfully behind the scenes on many occasions as both Set Designer and Production Manager. Other experience includes shows with the Wayne Players and the lead in THE DESK SET in Detroit at CTAM Play Festival. Don is a salesman.

KENNETH JOHNSON (Marlowe), a loyal member of AACT, will be remembered for his roles in ABRA-HAM LINCOLN, MAJOR BARBARA and ST. JOAN. He is a past member of the board and can always be relied upon to assist in the production aspects of our plays.

ANDY BOWMAN (Angela Marlowe), makes her debut with AACT in this show. She has been active in Ann Arbor Dance Theatre and has been a participant in various singing groups in Chicago. She is a student and housewife.

VEITCH REINHART (Mother), and husband Bob (see below) opened last year's AACT season playing husband and wife roles just as they do tonight. Veitch has appeared frequently in our productions, most recently GYPSY, NEVER TOO LATE, for which she won Best Actress Award and ALL THE WAY HOME. Veitch is an Administrative Assistant in the Department of Botany at the University.


