38th season - second production January 3-6, 1968 Lydia Mendelssohn Theatre Ted Heusel (Director) has been associated with Ann Arbor Civic Theatre for 17 years as both actor and director. Since 1950 when he directed his first play for AACT (The Silver Whistle) he has directed more than 50 of our organization's productions, many of which have won awards as the "Best Play of the Year," including the well-remembered "Miracle Worker." He has also won several AACT's best acting awards. He is program for Radio Station WOIA.

Runelda Medrano (Assistant to the Director) has been active in many phases of work for AACT. She has been a prominent figure back stage for the past four years in many productions, including work on sound, props, and stage crew. She was a member of the chorus in "Oklahoma." She was head usher for two years and AACT membership chairman for two years. She is married and works as secretary for Jabbour Builders. She also excels in roller skating. As a matter of fact, she has been director and choreographer of numerous roller skating shows.

Marion C. Francis (Ellen Gordon) is making her debut with AACT, but she has had much acting experience elsewhere. She spent two seasons in residence at the Westport Country Playhouse, Westport, Conn., and she was also active at the Ogunquit Playhouse, Ogunquit, Me. where she appeared in "Three Cornered Moon," "Warm Penninsula", and "The Bronte Sisters." Both she and her husband, a U of M graduate student in Chemical Physics, are native Easterners. While in Ann Arbor she is working as department secretary, Department of Communication Sciences, U of M.

Fred Gibilisco (John Cleves) is probably best remembered by AACT playgoers for his specialty dance in the "It's Too Darn Hot' number in "Kiss me Kate." He also appeared as Lewis in AACT's "View from the Bridge." Originally from California, Fred was with the Dramateurs of San Francisco and appeared in "Waltz of the Torreadors" for the Los Gatas Players in California. He also played the lead in the Ypsilanti production of "Who Was That Lady I Saw You With."

Aileen Mengel (Dorothy Cleves) lists housewife and teacher as her occupations, but AACT members would add to that list – actress, board member, costume chairman, among others. She has appeared in AACT's "The Grass Harp," "Romanoff and Juliet" and "Candida." A graduate in Speech from the U of M, she lived in Royal Oak until five years ago, where she was active with the Ridgedale Players, appearing in "Suddenly Last Summer," "The Marriage-Go-Round," "Summer of the Seventeenth Doll," "The Tender Trap," and "Witness for the Prosecution." She also was director of "Third Best Sport," "Night Must Fall," and "Blithe Spirit" for this group. Her husband is with the National Bank and Trust Company in Ann Arbor.

Conrad Mason (Cass Henderson) originally appeared only in AACT musicals. He was in "Pajama Game," "Three-Penny Opera," "Oklahoma," "Gypsy," and "Guys and Dolls." Last year he appeared in a non-musical for AACT for the first time – the role of Brundenell in "Devil's Disciple." He has also acted in "Who Was That Lady I Saw You With" and "King of Hearts" for the Ypsilanti Players. Going back to music again, he has appeared locally in 10 Gilbert and Sullivan shows. He is a physicist.
