

# The Might Thoreau Spent In Jail

#### Artistic Director SUSAN MORRIS

Susan Morris is both an actress and director of considerable accomplishment, and a familiar face to Ann Arbor theatre goers. She was most recently seen as Martha Brewster in our October production of Arsenic and Old Lace. Susie has also appeared for AACT in Arms and the Man and Misalliance as well as several studio productions, but she is probably best known for her work with the U-M Opera and for the Gilbert & Sullivan Society for which she appeared in a dozen roles during the sixties.

As a director, Susie has worked for both G & S and Civic Theatre. For G & S she has directed five productions in the last four years, including Yeomen of the Guard last spring. For AACT she has directed two studio productions, The Diary of Adam and Eve in 1973 and Thurber Carnival this past summer.

Susie was elected last May to a three year term on our Board of Directors and is serving this season as our production coordinator. She works as an administrative assistant for the Department of Romance Languages at U-M.

#### About the Play . . .

The man imprisoned in our play belongs more to the 1970's than to the age in which he lived . . . Time is awash in this jail cell. We are not trapped in happenings past, but we are concerned about THE NOW THOREAU — the explosive spirit who addressed himself to the perils of our time with more power and clarity than most angry young men writing now about NOW.

Thoreau is a fascinating paradox: a man who was - and is. A self-effacing giant. A man who rarely laughed. A man who loved so deeply and completely that he seemed, sometimes, not to have loved at all.







#### THE STAFF

Charles Sutherland (Producer), a familiar face to Ann Arbor audiences, has appeared in many shows for AACT, including White Liars, Once Upon A Mattress, Man of La Mancha, Lion In Winter, Ernest In Love, Tartuffe and Fiorello. Locker (Set and Lighting Designer) has designed the sets for the last five Gilbert & Sullivan productions, for the U-M School of Music's Tales of Hofman, and for the AACT Summer Season '74 shows. Tim is a free lance designer of sets, lights and props for television commercials, as well as live theatre, and is now working on the reconstruction of the theatre at the Ypsilanti Community Education Center.

Mildred D. Lintner (Costume Designer) has designed the costumes for AACT's productions of Most Happy Fella, As You Like It and Ernest In Love. She has designed and built the costumes for over 70 plays at Bowling Green State University where she teaches costume design. Milly is currently directing Life With Father at Bowling Green and commuting to Ann Arbor when needed.

Mindy Oddy (Stage Manager) has been the stage manager for four Civic Theatre shows: Company, Most Happy Fella, Thieves' Carnival and Ernest In Love. Two years ago she produced AACT's Annie Get Your Gun: she will serve as co-producer for our production of Oklahoma next May. Mindy teaches fifth grade in Hamburg.

#### THE CAST

William J. Cross (Henry Thourau) has appeared in numerous shows for AACT, including Hogan's Goat, Barefoot In the Park, Ten Little Indians and, most recently, as Mortimer in Arsenic and Old Lace. Bill has an M.A. in theatre from the U-M and works as an audio engineer at the School of Music.

John Wojda (John Thoreau) is appearing for the first time for AACT. His only other appearence in Ann Arbor was in the role of Oliver in the PTP production of As You Like It. John is a freshman at the U-M.

Edgar Lesher (Bailey) has been an active member of AACT for several years, working mostly on set construction. He made his stage debut this season (as one of the bodies) in *Arsenic and Old Lace*. Ed is a professor of Aerospace Engineering at the U-M.
