

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

went over every step again and again to make sure that every hand, foot and body was perfectly in place, thank you so much for your wonderful attention to detail.


To the cast that, simply put, worked their asses off for the last eight weeks to bring this show to life... Your outstanding efforts were second to none. I cannot begin to thank you enough.
