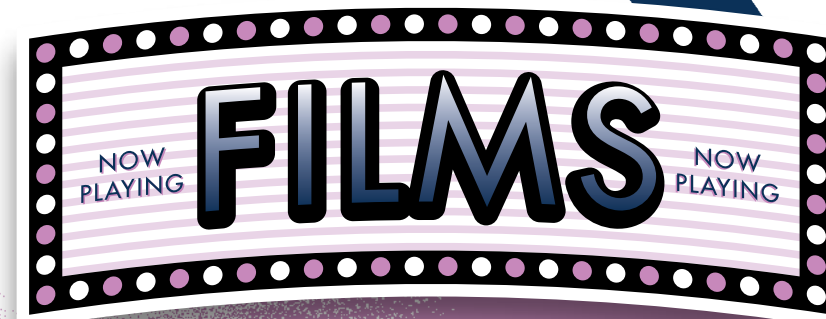

FILMS & DISCUSSIONS

The following films are cosponsored by the **University of Michigan Community Scholars Program**. Discussions will be led by experts on the film topic and the MCSP faculty and students. These films are not rated.

BLUEPRINT AMERICA: BEYOND THE MOTOR CITY | SEPTEMBER 22 | DT/4MR
Detroit, a symbol of America's diminishing status in the world, may come to represent the future of transportation and progress in America.

This 90-minute PBS documentary looks at what transportation in America could be in the future. Focusing on Detroit, the film suggests that with lots of space and the current lack of a major public transportation system, Detroit is a likely starting point for reform. "Transit is the key to equity for people," says one advocate of Detroit's transportation issues.

FREEDOM RIDERS | OCTOBER 27 | DT/MP

This acclaimed film is the powerful, harrowing, and ultimately inspirational story of six months in 1961 that changed America forever when more than 400 black and white Americans risked their lives—and many endured savage beatings and imprisonment—for simply traveling together on buses and trains as they journeyed through the Deep South. Deliberately violating Jim Crow laws, the Freedom Riders met with bitter racism and mob violence along the way, sorely testing their belief in non-violent activism.

From award-winning filmmaker Stanley Nelson, the film features testimony from a fascinating cast of central characters: the Riders themselves, state and federal government officials, and journalists who witnessed the Rides firsthand. This two-hour documentary is based on Raymond Arsenault's book, *Freedom Riders: 1961 and the Struggle for Racial Justice*. Says filmmaker Nelson, "The lesson of the Freedom Rides is that great change can come from a few small steps taken by courageous people. And that sometimes to do any great thing, it's important that we step out alone."

GASLAND | NOVEMBER 17 | DT/MP

Part vérité travelogue, part exposé, part mystery, part bluegrass banjo meltdown, part showdown, this one hour and 45-minute 2010 documentary won numerous awards, including an Oscar nomination for Best Documentary Feature.

Drilling for natural gas is a trend currently sweeping across the United States. The Halliburton-developed drilling technology of fracking, or hydraulic fracturing, has unlocked pockets of natural gas. But is fracking safe?

When filmmaker Josh Fox is asked to lease his land for drilling he heads out on a cross-country road trip to find the answer to this question. In one Pennsylvania town you'll see residents who are able to light their drinking water on fire.

**FILM & DISCUSSION: JUST BECAUSE I AM

This moving documentary follows a group of LGBT Windsor teens and young adults for a six-month period as they prepare their performance of *Waking Up Blue*, an original play that shares many of their own true experiences. The film takes the viewer through the journey of this youth group, led by an enthusiastic mentor, who gives a response to homophobia by creating a performance on love, respect and tolerance.

While experiencing the transformative energy of art and the empowering effects of self-affirmation, the teens also face aggravating homophobic reactions unleashed by their collective coming out in this traditionally conservative border city. Windsor filmmakers **Gabrielle Pescador** and **Juan Javier Pescador** will lead a discussion following the screening of their 60-minute film. *Just Because I Am* is not rated.

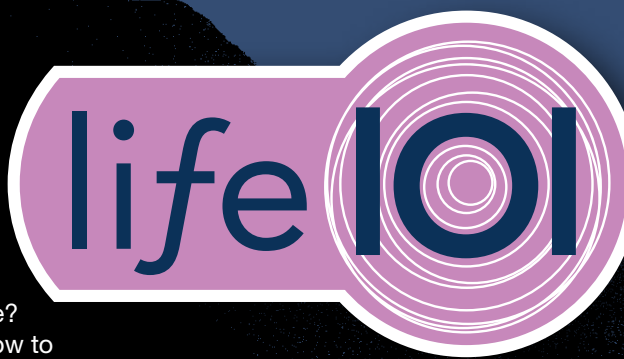

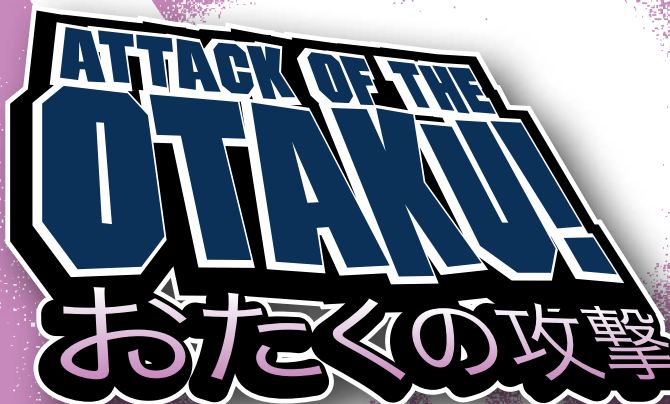

Learn how the original vision of what Petersen called *1149*, a tale that was closer to Disney's *Robin Hood*, reshaped itself into the classic series in comics, *Mouse Guard*. This medieval tale of mice in the natural world tells their story of surviving the dangers of daily life, thanks to the brave assistance of the noble brotherhood known as the Mouse Guard.
